- Solar powered ice chest development for vaccinations and insulin




REZ -Non -Transmissible Disease Cardiac /Respiratory

#### REZ -Rehydration/Sanitation


- Water purification systems

- Telemedicine for hydration dosing with IV
- Oral rehydration/ training for diarrhea vomiting or heat
